

During the 3 year completion, she continued to work full time and attended graduate school. She was presented with a State of Ohio Legislative Proclamation for her work and the SAFS director presented her with a signed hard hat. Several articles related to this project were published in The Sylvania Advantage News and The Toledo Blade. Completed December 2013.

UNIVERSITY EXPO - HSDC

As a former Asssociate Director, Erin initiated the University Expo in conjunction with AIA Toledo's Annual High School Design Competition. With a desire to connect students with "local" architecture programs, the expo presents opportunity for students to meet with university representatives from 9 architecture programs within a 5 hour radius of Toledo, Ohio The expo has been active since 2015, and includes schools from Ohio, Michigan and Indiana. Invitations also included Pennsylvania State University, Boston Architectural College and the University of Kentucky.



As a former Associate Director for AIA Toledo, Erin initiated an ARE Prep Program with grant funding from AIA Ohio and the College of Fellows, Consisting of monthly seminars, weekly study sessions and study materials, the data demonstrates the success of the program from 2015-2017. 31 individuals in 8 jurisdictions passed their attempted exams (91% pass rate) and 11 individuals during that time earned their license throughout Toledo, Cleveland, Columbus and Pennsylvania. In the years to follow, additional candidates passed exams and earned their license due to the availability of study material.

During an urban design studio at Lawrence Tech, a professor asked if students would assist in providing transportation for three Chinese exchange students to and from Detroit. One student in particular, made travel back to Toledo, part of his routine. During this time, Erin and her family helped Shi Lun explore many Ohio cities and introduced him to their heritage, holiday traditions, family and friends.

His exposure to the CURLEY family became inspiration for his book, which documents his experience and travels to 20 American cities in 54 days and the beautiful architecture he explored.






INTERRUPT MARKETING OFFICE: SYLVANIA, OHIO
