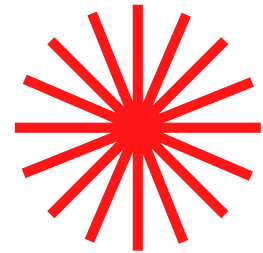

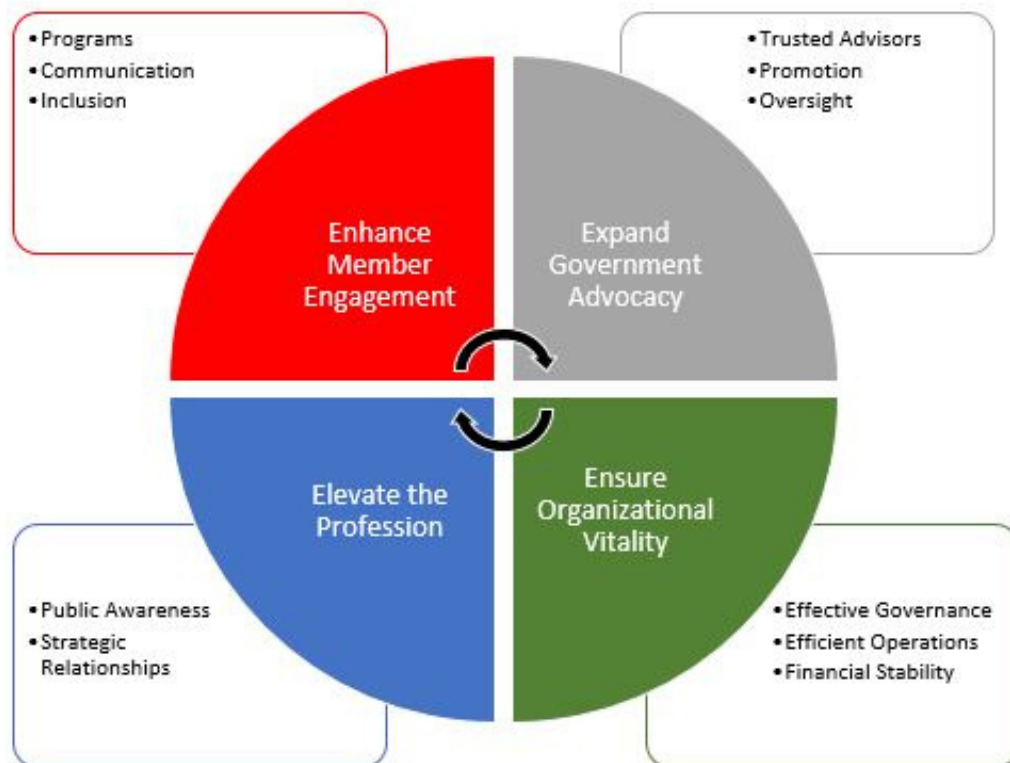

## AIA Ohio Design Symposium

This program was designed with two goals: 1) get members out in the community and 2) highlight and recognize the amazing architecture happening in Ohio through the AIA Ohio Design Awards Program. It was an astounding success for both! Three tracks (Mixed Use, Historic, and Visual & Performing Arts) offered 10 different tours of buildings throughout Cleveland.

### AIA Ohio Design Symposium Architectural Tours | Friday, Sept. 23 Mixed-Use Track



#### Tour Stop #1: Church + State

- Mixed-use building with 158 apartments across 2 buildings.
- The two buildings are built over a shared underground parking garage and connected by a pedestrian plaza between.
- The taller of the two buildings has additional parking built above the first floor commercial spaces before transitioning to residential units above.
- The shorter of the two buildings has a rooftop lounge and deck.
- The building was built as a panelized cold-form metal framed building over a post-tensioned concrete podium.

#### Tour Stop #2: INTRO

- New mixed-use building constructed of mass-timber.
- The building features multiple commercial tenants as well as residential apartments above.
- Amenities for tenants include rooftop deck with a pool, furnished guest suites reservable for visitors, a chef's kitchen and dining area to reserve for private events, and more.

#### Lunch: The Cleveland Clinic Samson Pavilion

- A partnership between the Cleveland Clinic and Case Western Reserve University, this new facility brings medical, nursing, dental, and physician assistant students together.
- This state-of-the-future, award-winning building features architectural, curricular, and technological innovations that are destined to elevate healthcare by transforming how students learn and collaborate.
- Designed by Foster + Partners and DLR Group as AoR, with tour led by architect Richard Becksted.

#### Tour Stop #3: The Artisan

- A new 298-unit 24-story apartment tower that includes a rooftop amenity level being constructed in University Circle.
- The Artisan is part of a larger master-planned development that includes the construction of a new Cleveland Public Library branch.

### AIA Ohio Design Symposium Architectural Tours | Friday, Sept. 23 Historic Track



#### Tour Stop #1: The May

- An iconic Cleveland landmark on Public Square for more than a century, the vacant May Company Department Store was rehabilitated and converted to mixed-use with retail, market-rate apartments, parking, a three-story atrium, tenant roof deck, and several other tenant amenities
- The \$165 million project utilized more than \$50 million in historic tax credits and was completed in 2020
- The May (May Co.) received the 2021 Distinguished Adaptation of a Cleveland Landmark Award, the year's highest honor, from the Cleveland Restoration Society and AIA Cleveland
- Originally designed by Daniel Burnham & Co.
- Tour led by Heather Rudge of Historic Preservation Group, LLC

#### Tour Stop #2: Downtown Walking Tour

- This downtown walking tour will begin with a brief overview of Cleveland's history. Stop will include the Old Stone Church (the oldest building on Public Square), Terminal Tower (Cleveland's most iconic building), the Soldiers and Sailors Monument, the Cleveland Public Library, and the Arcade
- Tour led by Scott O'Con of Tours of Cleveland, LLC

#### Lunch: The Cleveland Clinic Samson Pavilion

- A partnership between the Cleveland Clinic and Case Western Reserve University, this new facility brings medical, nursing, dental, and physician assistant students together.
- This state-of-the-future, award-winning building features architectural, curricular, and technological innovations that are destined to elevate healthcare by transforming how students learn and collaborate.
- Designed by Foster + Partners and DLR Group as AoR, with tour led by architect Richard Becksted.

#### Tour Stop #3: Maltz Performing Arts Center

- Located in Wade Oval, among Cleveland's most respected cultural institutions, The Temple-Tifereth Israel is repurposed as a new multi-disciplinary performing arts center for Case Western Reserve University
- A Sanctuary with Guastavino vaulted dome and stained glass clerestory is restored and converted into a Concert Hall suitable for carrying performance ensembles

### AIA Ohio Design Symposium Architectural Tours | Friday, Sept. 23 Visual and Performing Arts Track



#### Tour Stop #1: The Cleveland Museum of Art

- The institution's original 1916 Greek Revival building was restored to its intended prominence in a composition that connects it to and celebrates Marcel Breuer's 1973 addition through two new gallery wings that resolve the Museum's circulation.
- The additions enclose a new, light-filled vast central piazza, topped by a gently curving canopy of glass and steel, around which the entire renowned museum is newly organized.
- Designed by Rafael Vinoly Architects

#### Tour Stop #2: Maltz Performing Arts Center

- Renovation of the iconic golden-domed 1924 synagogue with an award-winning complementary 65,000 sf expansion
- Houses Case Western Reserve University's Music and Performing Arts programs, with a 250-seat proscenium theater and a 100-seat black box theater.
- Designed by DLR Group, with tour led by Ron Reed, FAIA and Vince Leskosky, FAIA

#### Lunch: The Cleveland Clinic Samson Pavilion

- A partnership between the Cleveland Clinic and Case Western Reserve University, this new facility brings medical, nursing, dental, and physician assistant students together.
- This state-of-the-future, award-winning building features architectural, curricular, and technological innovations that are destined to elevate healthcare by transforming how students learn and collaborate.
- Designed by Foster + Partners and DLR Group as AoR, with tour led by architect Richard Becksted.

#### Tour Stop #3: Cleveland Museum of Natural History

- Renovation and 50,000 sf expansion reinvents the 182,000 sf museum to increase program space and enhance the visitor experience.
- The design is inspired by the glaciers that formed the region's geology, with alluvial shapes that create a single and continuous form.
- Currently nearing the end of construction.
- Designed by DLR Group, with tour led by architect Mark Morris.

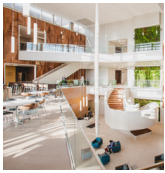
